Fall is an amazing season to be out and about! If you're looking for something fun and festive to do, Ozaukee County has great options, as well as great spots to do a little leaf-peeping.

Fall Harvest

Witte's Vegetable Farm in Cedarburg has long been a local and regional favorite for fresh, seasonal vegetables and fruits. From potatoes and cauliflower to pumpkins, onions and winter squash, this family-owned farm has been providing quality food for generations. Fall is a great time for exploring new veg-gies, or whipping up some savory favorites!

You know fall is in full swing when you see rows and rows of bright orange pump kins lining the driveway at the Appleland Farm Market in Fredonia, which is cele-brating its 55th year in business this year. Appleland is a great place to bring the family for a few hours of apple or pumpkin picking (bonus — they'll take you there in a wagon!) and they also offer pre-picked for your convenience — including more than 15 varieties of apples, so you're sure to find a new favorite. They're also a great place to pick up squash, honey, jams and fall decora-

DreamPort Harvest Market in Port Washington partners with family farms and producers to create a welcoming space offering organic, sustainable and truly local organic, seasonal foods. It's a great downtown spot to stop for apples, season fruits and vegetables, and delicious baked goodies. DreamPort is open Thursdays through Saturdays, 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Buechler Farms in Belgium

has its roadside stand open through the end of October for pumpkins, gourds, straw bales, corn stalks and other seasonal décor while supplies last. Be sure to check out their Harvest Fest, now through Sunday for wagon rides, petting zoo, music, food, movies and more! And mark your calendar for Boo! At the Barn, an adults-only event with music, prizes, raffle, a cash bar and more on Saturday, Oct. 29.

Fall Colors

Ozaukee County is a great place to take in the fall colors. Drive through our winding back roads from community to community for jaw-dropping vistas when the colors are at their prime, or visit some of our parks and nature preserves. Mequon Nature Preserve offers 510 acres and 6 miles of trails through developing forests, prairies and wetlands, and is open year round from sunrise to sunset.

Known for golf and winter sledding, Mee-Kwon Park in Mequon is also a great spot to take in gorgeous fall colors. The wooded areas on the south end of the park are undeveloped and have beautiful mature woods to walk

through.

Head to Hawthorne Hills Park, Saukville, for a 57-acre park area of undeveloped woodland that is sandwiched between Pioneer Village to the north, Herbert H. Peters Youth Camp to the east, and Hawthorne Hills Golf Course to the south. Drive to the center of the park for easy access ter of the park to easy access to hiking trails that cross the east end and enjoy the autumn leaves. Harrington Beach State Park, Belgium, is best known

for its more-than-a-mile-long Lake Michigan beach access But this 715-acre park also features a stunning white cedar and hardwood swamp. Hike on trails with a view of Lake Michigan or the old limestone quarry lake, or trek through the swamp trails to take in the leaves (be sure to bring proper shoes!). Harrington Beach State Park will have its observatory open the evenings of Friday, and Saturday, pending clear skies
