Other great places to visit include the Port Washington Historical Society Resource Center and the Cedarburg History Museum. Interested in enjoying the

finer things? Ozaukee County offers countless art galleries with incredible exhibits and artists. Located in the heart of Cedarburg is a stunning 1898 red brick Victorian building which is home to the Cedarburg Art Museum. With local and hiscollections exhibits, the Cedarburg Art Museum is not one to miss. A short walk away is the Cedarburg Cultural Center, a great place for viewing, classes and live entertain-ment. The Cedarburg PAC offers live concerts as part of their Visiting Artists Series, including the upcoming "Ricky Nelson Remembered," (Sept. 25) and "The Texas Tenors," (Oct. 8). Just east of the downtown Cedarburg area, you'll find the incredible Wisconsin Museum of Quilts & Fiber Arts. Visit their restored 1850s barn for their rotating exhibitions and tours.

If you are looking to indulge in some much-needed retail therapy, the shop-
